PART 1 (2 minutes)

I: City & Guilds International Spoken ESOL Test, Communicator Level. (*Give today's date.*) (NB This introduction only needs to be recorded before the first candidate's test begins, not for subsequent candidates.)

(Give candidates name.) Test begins. Hello. My name's (give full name). Can you spell your family name for me please?

- C: (Spells family name.)
- I: Thank you. And where are you from?
- C: (Responds.)
- I: Thank you. Now, in the first part of the test I'm going to ask you some questions about yourself. All right? (Choose **up to five** questions, one from each of the topic areas, as time allows. Name the topic; eq "Now, Home Life".)

- What kinds of things do you do with your family?
- Can you tell me something about family meals?
- Which member of your family are you most like? In what way?

Work

- How do you/will you use English in your job?
- What do you think would be the perfect job? Why?
- Is there a job you wouldn't like to do? Why not?
- Is the salary the most important thing for you? Why/why not?

Music

- Which sort of music do you enjoy listening to?
- What do you think about background music in shops and other public places?
- Which musical instrument would you most like to play? Why?
- Which music do you dislike most? Why?

The Environment

- Can you tell me something about the natural features in the area where you live?
- What kinds of things do you recycle?
- How can we improve the problem of litter?
- Can you tell me about an outdoor area where you like to spend time?

Sport

- How important is sport in your life?
- Do you think sports people are paid too much? Why/Why not?
- How much sport do/did you play at school?
- Which new sport would you like to learn? Why?

C: (Responds.)

I: Thank you.

Part 2 (2 minutes)

I: Now, Part Two. I'm going to read some situations. I want you to start or respond as necessary. First situation (*choose one situation from A*).

- I'm your friend. I start.
 "Hi! What're you doing this weekend?"
- I'm your English teacher. I start.
 "Tell me what you find most difficult about learning English."
- I'm your neighbour. I start.
 "I've run out of coffee. Could you lend me some, please."
- I'm a stranger in your town. I start.

 "Excuse me, where's the best place to eat around here?"
- C: (Responds.)
- 1: (Role-play the situation with candidate approximately two turns each.)
- I: Second situation (*choose one situation from B*).

- You're in a bank. You want to change some money into British pounds. You start.

- 1: (Role play a third situation from **A** or **B** if time allows.)
- I: Thank you.

Part 3 (3 minutes)

I: Now, Part Three. In this part of the test we're going to discuss something together. All right? (Hand over candidate's task sheet.)

We're planning a camping holiday for our English class. Here's some information about a camp-site. I have some further information about a different camp-site. Let's ask and answer questions to decide where to go.

Take twenty seconds to think about what you want to say. (20 seconds.) Why don't you start?
